Any emergency message should contain:

Location including terrain and grid reference, details and time of incident, suspected injuries, age of casualty, what assistance is required, number of people in party, your phone number.



If you can't get any message through, the International Distress Signal is 6 blasts on a whistle or 6 torch flashes - at 1 minute intervals.
